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Government Guidance

If the Government tell schools to go into lockdown due to coronavirus control measures, parents will be informed as soon as we find out. Teachers will resume the use of the home learning websites. They will use these to set work for their class in much the same way as they did while all schools were closed in March. However there will be the addition of zoom lessons with a focus on developing writing. These will not be for a whole class at the same time, instead they will take place in small groups to enable teachers to interact with their group and give specific feedback to each child during the lesson. These will take place at least once per week. This is just in case we are told to close. We have not received any guidance regarding impending school closures.

If you know that your family would have difficulties accessing on line learning due to lack of devices at home or WIFI difficulties please contact the school office so that we can make sure we are able to support you should it be necessary for the children to be learning from home. For the zoom lessons children will need to have sole access to a device for the duration of the lesson (at least 45 minutes).



Calls to Parents

While we would rather meet in person, they are still an important chance to discuss how your child has settled into the year and the progress they have made so far.

- We will send a selection of your child's exercise books home on Thursday 22nd October in your child's bag.
- Please have a look at them that evening and bring them back into school on the very next day (Friday 23rd October).
- As normal, you will receive a summary sheet for your child with grades for behaviour, perseverance, etc. This will be sent out on or before Wednesday 21st October.
- The calls you receive may be from the school number, a different 0207 number or a withheld number.
- The call must commence within 3 or 4 minutes into the booked time, otherwise we will have to rearrange another time.
- We will have to end the call one minute before the slot ends, to ensure we can keep to schedule as much as possible. Please be understanding of this.
